

IF A STUDENT IS QUARANTINED DUE TO COVID

(3) to provide asynchronous assignments and Office Hours in the case of a student or a subset of students testing positive for COVID and isolating as described in 3b below; and/or

Update on Compensatory Service Determinations for Students with IEPs

As a result of last year's Special Education Recovery Services (SERS) efforts, many students made significant progress and do not require special education services beyond those recommended on their Individualized Education Program (IEP) for the 2022–23 school year. For other students with IEPs who continue to experience gaps in learning as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, your school's IEP teams are required to identify these students and provide them with compensatory services.


Your school should first attempt to provide recommended compensatory services during the school day, to the greatest extent possible. In the event that recommended compensatory services cannot be provided during the school day or in existing DOE programs (e.g., Saturday related services sites or the Sensory Education, Exploration and Discovery (SEED) program), funding through a forthcoming School Allocation Memorandum (SAM) will be available to be used to facilitate provision of services, as determined by the IEP team; schools are not required to provide SERS to students after school or on Saturdays. Please note that services and/or instruction for these students will be addressed at their annual review meeting or post-evaluation meeting this school year.







Required

Does the schedule for progress monitoring make sense given assessment times, scope and sequence and support making adjustments to instruction?

REPORTING TO PROGRESS TO PARENTS

REPORTING PROGRESS TO PARENTS

Identify when periodic reports on the student's progress toward meeting the annual goals will be provided to the student's parents: at the same time school report cards are issued

LESSON PLAN/OBSERVATIONS

Lesson plans are for your use – cannot be told a format unless you have a TIP (many supervisors give a suggested format and there are suggestions in the SLP Practice Guide).

Lesson plans should not be mentioned in your formal observation write up.

Formal Observations: are for a full session, scheduled at a mutually agreed upon time. If you are tenured you must request in writing that you want a pre observation. Pre observations must be lesson specific.

Observations – receive your formal write up within 30 days. NOTHING regarding SESIS should be in the write up. ONLY what happened during the actual therapy lesson.

Informal Observations: 10-15 minutes, unannounced

We are under S/U and can only file a grievance if a procedure is broken.



MENTORING

Mentor is entitled to 2 periods (90 minutes) or 3 thirty-minute sessions (90 minutes) to provide support to the new teacher. Your caseload should be reduced, or you can work your preps)

Mentee is not entitled to any specific time and will meet on prep/admin time.

Mentor's responsibilities can include doing demonstration lessons, co-teaching with you, offering suggestions about behavior management and helping you plan your lessons)

Your discussions are confidential. Your mentor does no report back to your principal.

MISC

- How to become an IEP teacher? You can apply, you will lose your right to the speech provider position and the Medicaid differential.
- Help with retirement? Sign up for a pension consult.
- Are Speech Providers mandated to attend BIP meetings? Not mandated, but if your admin tells you to attend then you would.
- I share a room with the AP, is that OK? I would ask for different space
- Is there a chapter 683 leave of absence? No, unless you have a medical reason
- When a student gets a superintendent suspension what do I put in SESIS? If he is unable to attend and it is an in-school suspension, cancelled and state student unable to attend as he is serving an inschool suspension.
- Is entering encounter attendance in SESIS going away any time soon? It is not going away; DOE is looking to replace SESIS with a better improved program.
